## Compulsory Homework Activities

- Read your reading book at least 3x a week at home but ideally every day to build prosody.
- Share additional stories together as a family and talk about the key events/characters together.
- Use your word bags to practice sight reading of the words we have learnt in school (new words will be added as we learn them). This will be sent alongside some phonics to practise.
- NEW: We will send home five common exception words to practise each week, with a spelling strategy the children have practised in the classroom, e.g, pyramid writing. Weekly Homework Menu:
