If you want to repeat an activity in different ways, that is absolutely fine too! There are also additional homework tasks that can be accessed from the school website should you want them.

Choose 5 common exception words and write them using rainbow or pyramid writing	Choose a 2 digit numbers. Can you recognise the Tens value and the ones value?

Draw your favourite parts from a story or film and write some sentences to explain it. challenge: use and to join ideas.	Find number bonds to 10 and 20 and practice quick fire recall of them.

Research a part of the world you are interested in	Draw an outfit suitable for a polar exploration
Design an igloo	An idea of your own ☺
