# Pets Project

If you do not have a pet, your child could document a pet they know or a pet they would like to have. We are looking forward to learning about all of these animals!

## Reading

Please, please, please try to listen to your child read at least 3 times a week at home and write in the yellow reading record. It makes such a big difference to progress. The whole book does not need to be read in one go. A few pages at a time, re-reading for fluency, is often enough.

# Common Exception Words

In your child's book bag is a bag of the common exception words we have learnt so far. Children can use these as flashcards to practise. If they already know how to read these, they can begin to practise writing them.

We are having a big focus on letter formation and using finger spaces this coming term.
