This term we are thinking about contact- contact refers to the interactions we have with others online. Contact includes harmful interactions for example: peer pressure, adults posing as children with the intention to exploit, and commercial advertising. It is important we talk to our children about their online activity to monitor any risks. We teach our children to ask before going on a website, game or video, tell an adult if they see something that makes them feel unsure or worried and to keep information private - we do not share our name, birthday or any identifying information online.
