
Attendance

As you know we are always tracking our school attendance as we know that there is a direct positive link to children's outcomes if their attendance percentage is high and above 95%. We work closely with parents if their % levels drop below this figure to see how we can support them to ensure that children are in school on time everyday. We understand that certain medical conditions prevent children coming into school (high temperatures, vomiting and diarrhea illness (48 hour rule) as well as certain other conditions. In order to promote attendance we are going to celebrate class attendance each month in the Newsletter. The class with the highest attendance will be able to enjoy a class activity of their choosing.
